Program—Brian Bemel, Ojai Storytelling Festival

PROGRAM – BRIAN BEMEL OJAI STORYTELLING FESTIVAL



This presentation about storytelling began—of course—with a story. Brian was in his first year teaching second grade at Saticoy Elementary School when a hitchhiking bear showed him the impact storytelling could have on others. Brian had just finished scraping the ice off his tent . . . well, that's a story for another time.

During his career as a teacher, Brian sponsored shows at night and used the proceeds to fund daytime performances at school assemblies. He became the county's Arts Specialist, bringing performers to schools across the county. He founded Performances to Grow On and its signature event, the Ojai Storytelling Festival, now in its 21st year. The first year, there were three tellers. Now each year there are seven tellers, who Brian selects from the International Storytelling Festival in Jonesborough, Tenn., and from the recommendations of other tellers.

Brian's presentation included short videos of several tellers for this year's festival, with backgrounds ranging from Carnegie Hall to the Grand Ole Opry to Kenya to Hotdogastan. Stories include folk tales, personal stories, and stories appropriate for children, with juggling, swords, and words that paint pictures in your mind. This year's festival is October 27-30. If this is your first time, you can sample short performances from all the tellers at the Friday "laughing night" and decide who you want to hear more from.

The Project

Every year we cross the border into Tijuana and build a house in ONE DAY for a family. We start with a concrete slab and build the house from the ground up! We work on framing, painting, windows - the whole house! The family that receives the house will be working alongside us to help complete the project, and they provide us with a home cooked meal for lunch. It is one of the most rewarding experiences I have ever been a part of, and our club would love it if we could share the experience with you.

Cost: \$50.00 per person

Payment secures a spot on the bus to travel over the border. Bus leaves around 6am from San Diego and returns the same day by nightfall. We will not be spending night in Mexico. You will need to make and pay for your own Hotel accommodations.
