Seth Wilmoth and Liz Shura gave an enthusiastic presentation about SEEAG (Students for Eco-Education and Agriculture) at our October 26, 2022, meeting. Founded by Mary Maranville in 2008, SEEAG is a non-profit that opens the eyes of youth and the community to the farm origins of our food.

The STEM Careers Pathways in Agriculture program teaches middle and high school students about the job opportunities available in agriculture. The Child Wellness Initiative and the Farm Fresh Mobile Van bring local specialty crops to schools with cooking demonstrations. Farm Lab Academy sponsors field trips to farms and other agricultural businesses, reimbursing the schools for the cost of busing the students.

Students for Eco-Education and Agriculture



SEEAG is a nonprofit organization that aims to help young students understand the origins of their food by bridging the gap between agriculture and consumption through its agricultural education programming. SEEAG's "The Farm Lab" program based in Ventura County teaches schoolchildren about the origins of their food and the importance of local farmland by providing schools with classroom agricultural education and free field trips to farms. Through this and other SEEAG programs including Farm Day in Ventura and Santa Barbara counties, over 65,000 elementary school students and community members in Southern California have increased their understanding of the food journey.
