Program:

Dave Loe introduced our own Dave Bianco, who gave the day's program on Elder Hostel. Elder Hostel began in 1975 after Dave got the idea from seeing a friend with a shock of white hair standing in front of a Youth Hostel sign. Elder Hostel has revolutionized education for seniors. From its beginnings with only six women, whom Dave referred to as the "six apostles" that spread the word through articles and word-of-mouth, Elder Hostel now consists of over 10,000 programs throughout the world.



He noted that the program filled a need for people of the Greatest Generation that wanted to keep on learning, and now Baby Boomers are part of the picture. A name change now has the program known as Road Scholar. Its average attendee is 72 years old, but offers

education and adventure to knowledge-seekers of all

<u>Dave taught us a new word – opesmath</u>, which means a person who undertakes study late in life, a person who learns late in life (an old dog that can learn new tricks). He pointed out that age is something that doesn't matter unless you are a cheese!
