Program:

Kathy Werthheim introduced the program presented by Tom Reul, CEO of Learning Ally, a national non-



profit organization headquartered in Princeton New Jersey. The purpose of the organization is to put books on tape, CD's etc. to help those with problems learning from the written word.

The program was begun in 1950 in upstate New York by Ann McDonald as "Recording for the Blind" to help returning servicemen who had been blinded

during the war. With the help of the GI Bill, RFB expanded to 18 sites nationally, usually around a university campus.

As new learning disabilities have been identified, the name was changed to Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic and now has expanded even that definition, hence the new, all-inclusive name of Learning Ally. The organization makes available 65,000 textbook titles, all recorded by volunteers.

The annual budget is \$30 million, half provided by the federal government, but that federal money is being continued on p. 2
