

Today's speaker is Carol Castanon, the Director of the Nan Tolbert Nurturing Center based in Ojai.

Since receiving its 501c3 in 2002, the Nan Tolbert Nurturing Center has been helping young parents in Western Ventura County get the children off to the best start in life. With help from the State's First 5 Program and private donors, the staff work with low income parents to provide greater wellness to their infants and toddlers.

They are committed to instilling in the Ojai valley communities a profound and sincere understanding of babies and very young children during these critically important and formative years, for that is where their deepest patterns are set.

As their mission, they are dedicated to the nurture of children pre-birth to three, through inspiring partnerships and community resources that address pre and postnatal wellbeing, infant/ toddler development, and parent education and support.

In partnership with parents, health professionals, educators and the Ojai Valley community, they create opportunities to connect, to explore, and to engage directly in the development of healthy approaches to early childhood education.

- Therapy for Parents and Children

The Nan Tolbert Nurturing Center is designed as a responsive environment where parents can be present with their babies or toddlers who initiate and extend their own self-mastered exploration and discovery through play.

A highlight of the Games are the nine Scottish athletics



events, which is divided into different groups, and runs almost continuously during the course of the Games.


Ultimately, Chief John Lowry sees the Games as a means to show Scottish and Celtic pride of their culture and want to share its richness and variety.
