The Program was introduced by Mario de la Piedra. His co-worker at Barkley Insurance, Ed McClements, gave a detailed summary of what is expected to happen with the new Health Care Reform legislation.



The subject is controversial and challenging given that 15% of American citizens, or 45 million people are currently without insurance. Mr. McClements said that in 10 year's time without reform, that number would climb to 54 million. Even with reform during that same time period, 23 million people will still be

uninsured. Costs for employers and those currently insured are predicted to go up and 20 states have filed suit. Although the full effect of the new legislation does

The Council on Legislation of Rotary International recently adopted *New Generations as the Fifth Avenue of Service*.

Our District Governor, Deepa Willingham, writes in her September message: "Placing that kind of importance on the next generation is the rightful move for us Rotarians as we contemplate the future of our organization and that of our planet". And she continues, "We are lucky! A recent survey conducted with kids and young people revealed that, simply put, *the youth of today do care.* They care and they believe they *can and they must make a difference!*"

"Isn't that what Rotarians are all about? From the construction of the first "public comfort station" community service project in 1907, we have continued to serve others, we have worked towards solving many of humanity's problems, we have taken up challenging risks such as the eradication of Polio, and we have worked toward building goodwill and promoting peace."

"Now its time for us to 'mentor' ... Let us take the steps necessary to impart our knowledge and create our successors ... by mentoring them ... by supporting their projects ... by inviting them to our projects/meetings/conventions ... by sending them on humanitarian trips abroad ... and by understanding their culture and mode of communication! And when we have done all that, the New Generation can tell us 'I am thankful for the time you invested in me helping me to direct myself'."

D. 5240 Multi-Club 3-H Grant with R C Calcutta Metropolitan near Piyali Junction, Bengal, India

As many of you know, during 2008-09, our club participated with several other D. 5240 clubs in a 3-H (Health, Hunger & Humanity) grant in partnership with R C Calcutta Metropolitan (who already manage a school at Piyali for 130 underprivileged rural girls) to bring health and dental care, safe drinking water, sanitation, solar utilities, adult education and vocational opportunities, including micro credit, to the villages

near Piyali Junction (approx. 100,000 population).

These pictures were sent to us by Jayanta Chatterjee, current president of RCCM, who has been very instrumental in administering both the 3-H grant and related Matching Grants. He recently reported that the road from the school to the main road has been completed (you should have seen it before!!!); it was named Aarch Klumph Road. The computer lab (pictured) has been completed and vocational training for the women in the village(s) has begun. While it is not clear in the picture, all the D.5240 clubs who contributed to the grant, are listed on the plaque.

Pictured below are Jayanta C. (in white cap) and Vishnu Dhandania far left), who is the "guru of grant writing" not only in his district but also with TRF who consult with him on grant matters. RCCM is one of the most respected clubs in the Rotary world and we are, indeed, fortunate to have them as a partner on this project.
