Service and Fellowship

Marion-East Cedar Rapids Rotarians gather weekly and on special occasions to strengthen fellowship and ensure the effective functioning of the Club. The Club celebrates at the symphony or a baseball game; has a float in the Swamp Fox & St. Patrick's Day Parades, and hosts informal get togethers, golf outings, and family nights.

The Marion- East Cedar Rapids Rotary addresses community needs:

Our club raises money to provide school nurses in the Cedar Rapids / Marion metropolitan area the ability to directly help kids. School nurses identify students who are in need and who may not have the ability to wear appropriate shoes to school. Payless Shoe Source provides the Club with cards that are brought to a Payless Shoe store by the child and their parent or guardian.



They exchange their card for a new pair of shoes. For some of these children, this is the first time they have ever owned new shoes. The program began in 2003 with Marion schools, then expanded to the entire Cedar Rapids metro area in the fall of 2004. The need is great. Our club has given away more than 2,755 pairs of shoes to kids in the greater metro area. Special allocations were made to the Cities of Parkersburg and Eldora after both cities experienced natural disasters.
