APPLICATION SCORING

Judging for the overall application will be based on community service, employment history, financial need, articulation of future goals, and Four-Way test essay content and construction. Essays will be evaluated based on utilization and application of the principles of the Four-Way Test. Essays that do not incorporate the Four-Way Test will not be considered (see page 4). Applications will be evaluated by a volunteer committee of the Brattleboro Sunrise Rotary Club and the committee's decisions are final.

ESSAY GUIDELINES

The essay should focus on the Rotary's Four Way test. The test should be explicitly applied. The essay can focus on a topic of the applicant's choice to apply these principles.

- 1. Is it the truth?
- 2. Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

In explicitly addressing the Four-Way Test, the applicant is encouraged to use creativity and imagination. The essay may treat any subject of interest to the applicant; it may be specific or general. For example, one might relate the Four-Way Test to world peace, a special friendship, environmental issues, a choice of life-style, or a choice of occupation. Most importantly, the essay must include the principles of the Four-Way Test and demonstrate the way these relate to the topic presented.

Essays will be evaluated based on utilization and explicit application of the principles of the Four-Way Test. Essays that do not use the Four Way Test will not be considered. Applicant creativity, organization, language and grammar usage will be considered as part of scoring the essay. For full scoring explanation, please see page 1.

LENGTH AND PRESENTATION

Essays should be typewritten and should be between 500 and 1,000 words. Please double- or 1.5-space text.
