## **ESSAY GUIDELINES**

One way that Rotarians are challenged to reflect on their behavior is by using the "Four Way Test." About anything we *think*, *say or do*, Rotarians are invited to ask:

- 1. Is it the truth?
- 2. Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

Please construct an essay that applies this Four Way Test to your life. Think about a specific time, relationship, decision or event in your life when you could have applied these principles or they might have been helpful. How might these guides have impacted your thoughts, speech or action? How did what you think, say or do reflect these guides? Your essay can focus on any topic of your choice. You are encouraged to use your creativity and imagination.

Most importantly, the essay must explicitly address the Four Way test and apply it to the situation or event you choose. Essays will be evaluated based on utilization and explicit application of the Four Way Test. Essays that do not reference the Four Way Test will not be considered. Generic essays about service, community engagement, etc., will not score well in the process. Applicant creativity, organization, language and grammar usage will also be considered as part of scoring the essay.

#### **LENGTH AND PRESENTATION**

Essays should be typewritten and should be between 500 and 1,000 words. Please double- or 1.5-space text.

#### **ALTERNATIVE TO THE ESSAY**

If you are not able to construct an essay, or feel that another medium better allows you to articulate yourself, please send an email to the committee chair at <u>fischess(at)yahoo.com</u> **AT LEAST ONE WEEK** in advance of the deadline to make other arrangements, such as an interview or audio presentation.
