ROTARY CLUB OF NASHUA SCHOLARSHIP FUND

BACKGROUND

The Rotary Club of Nashua Scholarship Fund is administered by a volunteer committee of members of the Club to benefit students pursuing education beyond high school at trade schools, vocational and technical colleges or other 2 or 4-year post-secondary institutions.

AWARDS

A total of \$40,000 will be given in scholarships. A minimum of two \$10,000 awards will be payable at \$2,500 per year. An additional \$20,000 will be awarded at the discretion of the committee.

Although any student who meets the eligibility criteria may apply, preference may be given to those students who demonstrate the Rotary commitment of "Service Above Self" and/or who have participated in Rotary activities.

Award recipients will be expected to maintain a GPA of 3.0 and continue the commitment of "Service Above Self" in order to receive their multi-year awards and will be required to submit their annual transcripts and a brief update of their experiences.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to the Rotary Club of Nashua Scholarship Fund must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Resident of Nashua and a senior attending any Nashua high school.
- Plan to attend an accredited post-secondary institution, including technical colleges, trade schools, or two-or four-year colleges.
- Not an immediate family member of a member of the Rotary Club of Nashua.
- Willing to participate in an interview. Interviews will be either in-person or virtual at the discretion of the committee.

PROCESS

Completion of the Nashua Rotary Club Scholarship Application, which includes several short essays is required. Awards are based on criteria that include financial need, academic performance, community service, extracurricular activities, work experience, and Rotary participation. A small number of finalists may be invited for a face-to-face interview with the selection committee. Interviews are planned to be held during the month of April. Award recipients will be notified in early May and will be invited to attend a Rotary luncheon meeting in June to accept the award.

TO APPLY

Please complete the online application found at www.nashuarotary.org including responses to the essay questions found in the application. Applications must include brief financial information about your family and a copy of your current transcripts. We encourage letters of recommendation be submitted that focus on your qualifications based on the award criteria listed above. We recommend that at least one letter of recommendation be submitted by someone outside of your school who can attest to your qualifications.

To be considered, your application MUST BE TYPED AND SUBMITTED ONLINE OR VIA EMAIL. All application materials must be received by <u>RECEIVED BY 5:00 pm on FRIDAY,</u> <u>March 28th, 2025.</u>
