story tells of a merchant in a small town who had identical twin sons. The boys worked for their father in the department store he owned and, when he died, they took over the store.

Everything went well until the day a dollar bill disappeared. One of the brothers had left the bill on the cash register and walked



outside with a customer. When he returned, the money was gone.

He asked his brother, "Did you see that dollar bill on the cash register?" His brother replied that he had not. But the young man kept on questioning. He would not let it alone. "Dollar bills just don't get up and walk away! Surely you must have seen it!"

There was a subtle accusation in his voice. Tempers began to rise. Resentment set in. Before long, a deep and bitter chasm divided the young men. They refused to speak. They finally decided they could no longer work together and a dividing wall was built down the centre of the store. For twenty years hostility and bitterness grew, spreading to their families and to the community.

Then one day a man stopped in front of the store. He walked in and asked the clerk, "How long have you been here?"

The clerk replied that he'd been there all his life. The man said, "I must share something with you. Twenty years ago I came into this town. I hadn't eaten for three days. I came into this store from the back door and saw a dollar bill on the cash register. I put it in my pocket and walked out. All these years I haven't been able to forget that. I know it wasn't much money, but I had to come back and ask for your forgiveness."

The stranger was amazed to see tears well up in the eyes of this middle-aged man. "Would you please go next door and tell that same story to the man in the store?" he said. Then the man was even more amazed to see two middle-aged men, who looked very much alike, embracing each other and weeping together in front of the store.

After twenty years, the brokenness was mended. The wall of resentment that divided them came down. It is so often the little things that finally divide peoplewords spoken in haste; criticisms; accusations; resentments. And once divided, they may never come together again.

The solution is to let it go. There is really nothing particularly profound about learning to let go of little resentments for the sake of fulfilling and lasting relationships

May we as Rotarians build and not break bonds of love and friendship

# SPEAKER'S CV




IPP DATO' MUSLIM AYOB

PP Dato' Muslim is one of our senior Rotarians having joined the Pudu Rotary Club in 1975. However, he had a break in 1980 but rejoined the Club upon his retirement from the Air Force in 1994. He has served the Club in various capacities and was responsible for the Club's website since 1996 to-date. He was the Club President in RY 1998-99 and later served the District as the IT Chair and Literacy Chair until 2006. He is a PHF and JRF contributor. For his services to Rotary he was recipient of the Avenues of Service Award. And most recently, he was re-elected as the President of the Club for RY 2015-16 as the first *recycled* President of the Rotary Club of Pudu.

Dato' Muslim joined the Royal Malaysian Air Force on 2 Jan 1959, just six months after it was formed. The Air Force was formed on 1 June 1958. Thus he was one of the pioneers in the Air Force. He had an illustrious career in the Air Force, having served in various capacities and was responsible for setting up **three** major units of the Air Force; namely AIROD, the Air Support Command and the RMAF Inspectorate. He served the Air Force for 35 years and retired in July 1994 in the rank of Major General upon reaching the age of 55. So he has been a pensioner for 22 years now.

His passion is IT; and travelling – not the usual common-or-garden variety – but overland 4x4 off road. In 2013 he was in the Australian Outback and in 2014 he did Mongolia and Siberia. Last year he had to cancel a KL-London trip via Russia and Scandinavia to devote time to his Presidency; and likewise this year because of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Exhibition events. Next year, God willing, he'll be off to Africa – again!

In 1905, Paul Harris organized the first Rotary Club "in fellowship and friendship" with three clients and local businessmen. His initial goal was solely to create a club of professional and business men for friendship and fellowship. Little that he realised that his simple fireside chat ended up with the creation of Rotary clubs in >200 countries in the world with a membership of >1.2 million Rotarians.





### ROTARY FOUNDATION NAMED WORLD'S OUTSTANDING FOUNDATION FOR 2016



The Association of Fundraising Professionals has recognized The Rotary Foundation with its annual Award for Outstanding Foundation.

The award honors organizations that show philanthropic commitment and leadership through financial support, innovation, encouragement of others, and involvement in public affairs. Some of the boldest names in American giving — Kellogg, Komen, and MacArthur, among others —are past honorees.

"We are honored to receive this recognition from the AFP, which gives us even more reason to celebrate during our Foundation's centennial year," says Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair Kalyan Banerjee. "The continued strong support of Rotary members will help us keep our promise of a polio-free world for all children and enable the Foundation to carry out its mission of advancing world understanding, goodwill, and peace. We look forward to another 100 years of Rotary members taking action to make communities better around the world."


The announcement came on 15 November, known to industry professionals since the 1980s as National Philanthropy Day. The award will be presented in early 2017 at the AFP's annual conference in San Francisco.


Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair-elect Paul Netzel is set to accept the award on Rotary's behalf, and Eric Schmelling, director of fund development at Rotary, will speak at the conference. The event is expected to draw more than 3,400 senior-level fundraising professionals from 33 countries.

"While almost everyone is familiar with Rotary, not everyone may realize just how much of an impact Rotary and The Rotary Foundation have had on countless people and communities across the globe," says Jason Lee, AFP president and CEO. "On behalf of the entire charitable sector and people around the world, all of us at AFP are honored to be able to recognize The Rotary Foundation as our 2016 Outstanding Foundation." AFP's committee of judges cited Rotary's comprehensive campaign to eradicate polio as a major driver of the selection. They also mentioned that Rotary applies a methodical, purposeful approach to support a wide variety of causes, from providing clean water to educating the next generation of peace professionals.
