omeone told me that one of his best friends had been killed in a private plane crash. Something happened at the service that he'll never forget. At the memorial service, his friend's wife walked to the podium to speak to the gathering. She said a friend had asked her the best memory she had of their life together. At the moment, she had



been too grief-stricken to answer, but she thought about it since and wanted to answer the question.

They were in their late forties when he died, and she began talking about a time in their lives almost twenty years earlier. She had quit her job to obtain her master's degree, and her husband never wavered in his support. He held down his own job and also did the cooking, cleaning, and other household chores while she studied for her degree.

One time, they both stayed up all night. She was finishing her thesis and he was preparing for an important business meeting. That morning, she walked out on their loft, looked at him over the railing, and just thought about how much she loved him. She knew how important this meeting was to his career, and she was feeling guilty that she didn't even have time to make his breakfast. He grabbed his briefcase and hurried out. She heard the garage door open and close, but much to her surprise, she heard it open again about thirty seconds later. From above, she watched her husband dash into the house and walk over to the neglected coffee table. Tracing his finger through the dust, he wrote the words "I love you." Then he raced back to his car.

The new widow then looked out at her audience and said, "John and I had a wonderful life together. We have been around the world several times; we've had everything money can buy...but nothing comes close to that moment."

Our lives move with lightning speed. It feels like yesterday that I graduated from college...and now forty years have passed. Although I'm very proud of my business accomplishments, in the end, my life comes back to loving and being loved.

This story about a husband's random act of love always reminds us that the smallest things can make the biggest difference to those around us. It reminds us to do little things for the people we love and to show them how much they mean to us.

I hope this story inspires us to love and be loved.


CV OF IPP DATO' MUSLIM AYOB

PP Dato' Muslim is one of our senior Rotarians having joined the Pudu Rotary Club in 1975. However, he had a break in 1980 but rejoined the Club upon his retirement from the Air Force in 1994. He has served the Club in various capacities and was responsible for the Club's website since 1996 to-date. He was the Club President in RY 1998-99 and later served the District as the IT Chair and Literacy Chair until 2006. He is a PHF and JRF contributor. For his services to Rotary he was recipient of the Avenues of Service Award. And most recently, he was re-elected as the President of the Club for RY 2015-16 as the first *recycled* President of the Rotary Club of Pudu.


Dato' Muslim joined the Royal Malaysian Air Force on 2 Jan 1959, just six months after it was formed. The Air Force was formed on 1 June 1958. Thus he was one of the pioneers in the Air Force. He had an illustrious career in the Air Force, having served in various capacities and was responsible for setting up **three** major units of the Air Force; namely AIROD, the Air Support Command and the RMAF Inspectorate. He served the Air Force for 35 years and retired in July 1994 in the rank of Major General upon reaching the age of 55. So he has been a pensioner for 22 years now

His passion is IT; and travelling – not the usual common-or-garden variety – but overland 4x4 off road. In 2013 he was in the Australian Outback and in 2014 he did Mongolia and Siberia. Last year he had to cancel a KL-London trip via Russia and Scandinavia to devote time to his Presidency; and likewise this year because of the 50th Anniversary Exhibition events. Next year, God willing, he'll be off to Africa – again!



ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Bill Gates to keynote convention



Rotary's 108th annual <u>international convention</u> June 10–14 is expected to attract 40,000 Rotary club members from over 160 countries, and will inject an estimated \$52.3 million into Atlanta's economy. Bill Gates will speak at this year's Rotary International Convention.

Often described as a "mini-United Nations", Rotary's third convention in Atlanta will transform the Georgia World Congress Center into a cultural kaleidoscope as the organization's global network of volunteers gather to exchange ideas on how to improve lives and bring positive, lasting change to communities around the world.

Registrants will engage in workshops and hear from a lineup of world-class speakers, including Bill Gates, co-chair, of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. The Gates Foundation and Rotary International have an ongoing match of 2:1 to support polio eradication efforts up to \$35 million a year. Today in Bill and Melinda Gates' Annual Letter they reaffirmed the important role Rotary has played in polio eradication.

"Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation have been working together on polio eradication for a long time, and our strong partnership will continue through the final years of the effort," said Rotary International President John Germ. "With the most effective resources in place, it's possible that we will soon see the last case of polio in history. At the convention, Bill will say more about how we can — and will — end polio."

Organized by Rotary International in conjunction with the <u>Atlanta Host Organizing Committee</u> of local Rotary members, registrants of the convention will also get to experience Atlanta's southern charm with visits to the World of Coca-Cola, the College Football Hall of Fame and an Atlanta Braves game.

"The Rotary International Convention provides an exceptional opportunity to bring together more than 40,000 civic and business community leaders from throughout the world to Atlanta to enjoy our unique brand of southern hospitality," said William Pate, president and CEO of the Atlanta Convention and Visitors Bureau. "The addition of Microsoft founder Bill Gates as a keynote speaker reflects the importance and good work that Rotary does worldwide."

The global eradication of polio has been Rotary's top priority since 1985. Through the Global Polio Eradication Initiative – a public-private partnership that includes Rotary, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) – the incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99.9 percent, from about 350,000 cases a year in 1988 to just 37 confirmed in 2016. Rotary, including matching funds from the Gates Foundation, has donated \$1.6 billion to polio eradication.


Atlanta's first Rotary convention took place 100 years ago, when The Rotary Foundation was established with its first contribution of \$26.50. The Rotary Foundation's assets have grown to approximately \$1 billion, and more than \$3 billion have been spent on projects and scholarships that promote peace, fight disease, provide clean water, support education, save mothers and children, and grow local economies.


