The **Five Avenues of Service** are Rotary's philosophical and practical framework.

- **3.** <u>Community Service</u>, efforts to improve the quality of life of those who live within this club's locality.
- **4.** <u>International Service</u>, activities to advance international understanding, goodwill, and peace by fostering acquaintance and through club activities and projects designed to help people in other lands.
- **5.** <u>Youth Service</u>, recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, involvement in community and international service projects, and exchange programs.

Changes by the 2016 Council on Legislation

- Clubs may decide to vary their meeting times, may meet online or in person, and may decide when to cancel a meeting, as long as they meet at least twice a month.
- Clubs have flexibility in choosing their membership rules and requirements.
- The <u>six membership criteria was removed</u> and replaced with a simple requirement that a member <u>be a person of good character</u> who has a good reputation in their business or community and is willing to serve the community.
- Clubs may offer additional membership types such as associate, corporate, family membership or others.
