Dr. Reuss also noted the critical and active role Germany is playing (UNIFIL) for the past several years. He stated the significance of the recently issued "Declaration of Strong Support" by the German Government.







Dr. Reuss stressed the strategic importance of Lebanon in the region and specifically, to Europe. He noted the need for reform in many aspects of the Lebanese Society, namely in the areas of Justice, Education, and Economic Development, and how Germany and the rest of Europe can assist in this endeavor.

With the spirit of the season, Santa surprised the kids with his usual generosity, which sealed the delightful afternoon with the beautiful smiles on the kids' faces








Members of RCBC were privileged to share that heartwarming afternoon with these lovely kids.


WELCOME 2018

→ On January 16, a joint dinner meeting with Rotary Club of Beirut was held at the Phoenicia Hotel. The Guest Speaker was Mrs. Raya Haffar El Hassan, the former Minister of Finance and the current Chairman-General Manager of the Tripoli Economic Zone.



The title of the talk was Economic Development 2017-2018 Highlights and Outlook. In her remarks, Mrs. El Hassan set the stage with a quick review of macroeconomic results of 2017. In spite of a 2% GDP growth, the economy remains under pressure due to the recent increase in wages to the public sector and the resulting widening deficit in the budget.















Mrs. El Hassan went on to address the challenges and opportunities of 2018 and beyond, The three international conferences planned for the first quarter of 2018 are key to restore the financial health of the Lebanese economy. The intent of the government is to attract investments that can be leveraged to fund projects aimed at modernizing the crumbling infrastructure in many parts of the country, resolve the chronic shortage of electricity and improve transportation.



Mrs. El Hassan pointed out that every one billion dollars invested in the country can add 2% to GDP and provide significant increase in employment, thus reducing the high unemployment we have in the country.

Mrs. El Hassan went on to address the prospects of Lebanon joining the club of Oil & Gas producing countries. She pointed out that while the prospects look encouraging, the road to actual production, distribution and sale is long and can exceed 10 years. She also pointed out that the current debate about setting a Sovereign Fund is premature as it took Norway 17 years after the discovery of oil to set up their fund.



The success of every Rotary club is largely dependent on the hard work and dedication of its members. RCBC has a pool of talented individuals who exemplify Service Above Self in every avenue of service.

In the business meeting of January 23, our very own George Beyrouti shared his expertise on Global Grants with members of the club.

He gave a comprehensive overview of what are Global Grants, what are the terms for qualification for such grants and the conditions attached with it. He went on to outline all the service projects in the pipeline and already approved for Global Grants for RCBC. We are thankful for the success we enjoy and for the continued support of our international partners who believe in the good work we do in Lebanon.





The month of January culminated with a business meeting on January 30, featuring our guest speaker Mrs. Rita Srour Rassie, a Masters Degree candidate in Cognitive Behavioral Psychology.

Mrs. Rassie's topic for the evening was Personality Disorders, a subject that sparked lots of questions and comments.

Mrs Rassie started her presentation by defining Personality as a way of thinking, feeling, and behaving that differentiates individuals from each other. Personality Disorder is a way of thinking, feeling and behaving that deviates from the expectations of one's culture, causes distress and dysfunction that lasts for a period of time.



The factors that contribute to the various personality disorders:

- Genetic predisposition 30-50% of cases.
- Life experiences
- Traumatic events
- Family interactions
- Sociocultural factors such as age, sex, nationality, culture, religion, profession, etc.











The types of personality disorders fall in three clusters :

- Cluster A includes paranoid, schizoid, and schizoidal compulsive.
- Cluster B includes antisocial, borderline histrionic and narcissistic.
- Cluster C includes the avoidant, dependent and obsessive.

The three main psychological structures are:

- a) Neurosis
- b) Psychosis
- c) Borderline







Mrs Rassie explained about each of these disorders in a very clear and interesting fashion and left the audience to do their own interpretations of what category they might fall in. There are no perfect personalities because everyone can exhibit a slight variation of the norm...it only becomes pathological when certain manifestations repeat themselves systematically over a long time and become a pattern of behaviour that causes distress and dysfunction.







She concluded her presentation with a quotation from T.S.Lewis: "it is not the load that breaks you down, it is the way you carry it".
