July 21,2020

Due to the Economic situation and the ongoing Covid19 threat, RCBC President Habib Saba and his board had to make a change of venue and rethink all club meetings till December 2020. The new venue will be Hilton Hotel in Beirut, and meetings continue to be at 7 pm whether virtual or personal.

Following social distancing and mask use, club members met to conduct first business meeting where the President and all committee chairpersons presented their vision for RY 20-21.

The Club assembly adopted the following agenda:

- 1. Venue, Annual Membership Dues and Business Meeting Fees
- 2. Proposed District 2452 Budget Approval
- 3. Introduction of RCBC Board and committee chairpersons
- 4. President Habib Saba highlighted the theme of this Rotary year: Sustainable Living.
- 5. Sustainability ideas to support the theme: sustainable development, with the underlying priorities of fighting poverty, treating diseases/ accessible healthcare, cultural and civic education, and environmental preservation and sustainability.
- 6. To stay ahead of the curve, RCBC needs to be creative in its tackling of urgent community issues, do multiple diverse projects and keep an eye on national and global impacting issues .
- 7. Important milestones this year: Greater Lebanon Centennial Anniversary in September and RCBC Silver Jubilee.
- 8. Emphasis on our partnership with RCBC Rotaract and Interact Clubs to unite our efforts in achieving our mission for serving the community.
- 9. The draft budget for RY 2020-2021 was presented, discussed and approved.

It was unanimously agreed however that given the volatile and rapidly unfolding situation in the country that the Venue and pricing, events and meetings, and the budget would need to be regularly monitored and reviewed if necessary

Rotary International added a new area of focus, which is Environment so we now have seven areas of focus.

The strategic plan for this year will fall in line with the new focus with projects and guest speakers.

Rotaract Club Vision

The plan outlined by BCRAC President Carla Bou Diab included: Communty Service, Professional development and Club Service. Their main area of focus this year is Environmental Service featuring Recycling, delivery of food boxes, Beach Cleanup and greening of Lebanon. BCRAC will stay in touch with current events and needs and will respond by creating projects, online campaigns and contributions with different NGOs.

"They say an arrow is short by pulling it backwards. We know that everything around us is falling apart but we also know that we are powerful enough to respond to what's going on . Our actions count , no matter how small, and we will never stop acting".

Interact Club Roadmap

The interact club of RCBC is a fairly young club, having received it's RI certification in President Said el Kadi introduced his board and together with his VP and CS gave a very professional and well constructed plan for the year. The club demographics are gender balanced and equal. Of the 16 current members, 9 members come from The American Community School, 4 from College Protestant Francais and 3 from International College. The club goals are:

- Diverse and Organic Recruitment: grow the club to 35 members by July 2021 with no more than 50% from one school.
- Professionalize: develop strategies for projects, events and meetings. Develop the club constitution on and bylaws, develop election and pinning processes.





- Standardize: this includes annual and biannual fees, develop annual events and projects and adopt practices to enhance community building and members bonding.
- Profile Enhancement: strengthen social media presence.
- Balanced events: these should include community service projects plus professional and personal development like attending RYLA yearly.
- National and Regional Leadership: the club hopes to become a leader in Lebanon and the region. This can be achieved by publicizing initiatives, developing friendship ties with other Interact Clubs and hosting a national event/ workshop every year.


A line up of upcoming events was shared for service and fellowship. They will be meeting once a month in a permanent location that is under study.


