



LETTER FROM THE EDITOR PP MONA JARUDI

On February 21,2025, Istanbul hosted over one thousand Rotarians from all over the world to celebrate Peace under the big banner "Healing in a Divided World". Throughout the conference, there were key words reverberating: Polarization, Conflict, Bridging Divides, Healing, Understanding, Commitment, and Dedication, all very important words that outline the journey towards achieving lasting peace.

As a humanitarian organization, peace is a corner stone of Rotary's mission. By carrying out service projects and supporting peace fellowships and scholarships, Rotarians take action to address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, discrimination, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources. Our commitment as Rotarians to peace building answers new challenges: how we can make the greatest impact and how we can achieve our VISION for lasting change. Rotarians are approaching the concept of peace with greater cohesion and inclusivity, broadening the scope of the meaning of peace building and finding ways for more people to get involved.

In her opening remarks, RI President Stephanie Urchick described the dedication required for true healing to take place in our polarized world. "Our time together here is a testament to our shared belief in the power of peacebuilding, but let's acknowledge something essential: the Act of 'Healing in a Divided World' is not something we can achieve quickly or easily. It takes an intentional commitment over time."

The different guest speakers over two days outlined how that commitment could take shape.

- 1. In technology: the impact of artificial intelligence, ways technology can bolster peace building efforts and the wide threat of misinformation. Sheldon Himelfarb, an award-winning film maker and the founder of PeaceTech Lab, called for peace builders to forge a global response to MISINFORMATION. The danger it poses, he said, is comparable to that of war, pandemics and climate change.
- 2. Environmental Issues in the MENA region is considered one of the world's hotspots which makes it highly vulnerable to negative impacts of global warming. One speaker said "we have to understand that there will be no lasting peace between countries throughout the middle east if the protection of our shared environment is not put at the center of conflict resolution."
- 3. The Peace Fellowship Program, a collaboration of Rotary with the Institute of Economics and Peace (IEP) provides certificate and Masters degrees from the nine Peace centers worldwide in top universities where more than 1800 Rotary Peace fellows have graduated. Another Peace Center was inaugurated in Istanbul on Sunday February 23, 2025 at Bahçeşehir University in Istanbul thanks to a \$ 15.5 million gift from Otto and Fran Walter Foundation.
- 4. The Rotary Action Group for Peace is another avenue for promoting peace building. Two weeks ago, the Lebanon Chapter was launched of which Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan is a charter member.

5. During last week in Istanbul as well, 37 Peace Activators from the MENA region were certified by Rotary International in collaboration with the Institute for Economics and Peace. This was an intensive three-day training where we were provided with the tools and additional skills to build positive peace. I am very proud to be among the 37 people who were certified. Together we can work on projects that will help in eliminating conflict and promoting peace.

As Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan, our work on peace building started in 2018-19, where we participated in D-2452 initiative led by PDG Michel Jazzar, Civic Education for Peace Building. And that year, Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan also commenced on a new Global Grant, NewGen Peace Building, where 100 University students underwent training, designed their own projects with their mentors, which culminated in 25 train the trainers certification to carry on with peace building.

In June 2023, Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan led by PP Mona Jarudi chartered the first youthled Peace Building Club in the world,

Beirut Pax Potentia who are an independent Rotary Club doing great work and leading meaningful projects. We, as Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan, are very proud of recognizing the importance of Peace Building and inclusivity which put us as a leading club in our work in the seven areas of focus.

Our success as Rotarians has been rooted in partnerships, between clubs, districts, local communities or with global institutions. The challenges we face today demand combined efforts of all sectors to amplify our impact and drive real progress. Our work, our service, our members are what makes Rotary what it is and our unity of purpose and fellowship is what creates The Magic of Rotary!








Rotary's Four Roles in Promoting Peace




PEACE in our time? What's a Rotarian to do?

For more than 100 years, Rotary International and its members have been advocates for peace. In fact, what is known as the "fourth object of Rotary" is to "promote international understanding, goodwill, and peace." Just over 20 years ago, Rotary made a strategic investment in this ideal by creating a system of Rotary Peace Centers around the world and identifying leaders with experience in peace and development to benefit from fellowships for study and reflection at these centers. Less than 10 years ago, RI further expanded its commitment to Peace as an Area of Focus through a strategic partnership with the global research and think tank Institute for Economics and Peace (IEP).

Now what? There are a variety of indications that social cohesion, trust, and peace have been declining worldwide. Yet, the conversation within Rotary about "positive peace building" has increased. The speaker poses the question in her remarks "How do Rotarians contribute to Peace in the age of pluralism"- a state of society in which communities and countries live in unity by celebrating diversity?"

Ms Shafer also spoke about the 8 Pillars of Peace, her work with us, Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan, for NewGen Peace Builders/ Lebanon and her love and appreciation for the country and its people. She elaborated on her work Bridges to New Horizons, a program that was developed two years ago advocating for a world with young people at the center of global peace building.

PDG George sent our club a note recognizing the great work that RCBC continues to do as a leading rotary club in Lebanon


















Launch










Message from RI President 2025-2026
