Business Meeting Via Zoom

November 14,2023

The world this past year has been witnessing unprecedented calamities, war atrocities, hunger, migrations and in certain areas catastrophic economic situations. Lebanon, the tiny country on the Mediterranean, has been undergoing for the past four years the worst threats politically, socially and economically. Its location has proved to be a curse than a blessing. Since 1948, Lebanon has been receiving refugees from nearby countries and to date there are over 1.6 million refugees from the Occupied Palestinian territory, from Iraq and Syria, numbers that are equivalent to its citizens which are taxing its infrastructure and social fabric.

Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan invited the United Nations High Commission for Refugees Representative Mr. Ivo Freijsen to shed a light on the refugee status in Lebanon and perhaps share glimpses into what's next.


Mr. Freijsen has 30 years of experience in the Humanitarian field and has lived in many countries and speaks five languages fluently including Arabic. He started his talk by saying that there are 110 million people displaced in the world, 60% are internally displaced and 40% are refugees. Of this high number, 40% are children and that is a real sad statistic. Climate change plays an important role in forcing people to leave for better climates and if existing political conflicts and wars are not mitigated; every border will be flooded with refugees. The following facts present themselves:


- Lebanon has the highest proportion of refugees in the world. There are 1.5 million Syrians, not to mention other nationalities.
- Refugees do not flee because of generous aid packages but due to life threatening conditions due to direct and indirect consequences of conflict.
- People do not resist returning to their abandoned countries due to the good life they experience in refuge.
- The challenges faced in Lebanon:
 - A. The majority live under the poverty line
 - B. International assistance does not cover everyone and the assistance is shrinking
 - C. With dwindling funds, there is an increase reliance on negative coping mechanisms. Refugees have enormous amounts of debt so they reduce their food consumption and take their children out of school to work and help with daily livelihood.
- The host community, Lebanon, has similar challenges: huge economic crisis, schools are closing, high health care costs and lack of jobs.
- Add to all this now, the precarious security in the South, that has created another layer of refugees, 26,000 of them to further tax our infrastructure.
- UNHCR response, past and present:
- Coordinating with the Lebanese government to protect the rights of the refugees to access basic needs.
- Helping to find durable solutions to resettle refugees to other countries or force the voluntary return to Syria.
- Studying the impact of displacement on peoples' lives and continue to provide support to refugees and host communities.

Since 2011, UNHCR gave \$ 378 million to Lebanon to contribute to the Lebanese crisis and mitigate the impact of the refugees on the host country. More than \$ 177 million went to help host with solar panels, waste water management and street lighting. Over \$ 9.6 billion was received by Lebanon since 2015 under the Lebanon Crisis Response Plan coordinated with the Lebanese government.

In response to the concern of the audience, Mr. Freijsen assured us that there is NO international conspiracy to keep refugees in Lebanon and no Hidden agendas by the international community.

The audience were very appreciative of the remarks and the work of UNHCR in Lebanon with the hope that durable solutions will be found to satisfy the good livelihood of all.

"A TOUR & TALK ABOUT THE SURSOCK MUSEUM AND ITS HISTORY"

The Sursock Museum

November 28,2023

Beirut Sursock Museum, one of the most important cultural landmarks in a country seeped in culture, a unique structure showcasing the beauty of artisanal craftmanship, be it breathtaking stained-glass windows or intricate woodwork from the finest cedars of Lebanon, or the beautiful scents from a garden rich with jasmine.

On Tuesday November 28, Sursock Museum was our meeting venue. We wanted to be part of the perfect reconstruction work that took three years to complete after the devastating Beirut Port Explosion that disemboweled half of our beautiful Beirut. The reconstruction was done lovingly and to perfection by Lebanese artisans and craftspeople who continue to make their mark in preserving our rich Lebanese heritage and culture.

The director of the museum Ms Karina Helou was gracious to open the doors of the museum for our club and treated us to a private guided tour, recounting the history, reliving the explosion moments and painstakingly showing the extensive research done in order to bring the museum back to life.

The museum opened its doors on 18 November 1961 with an "Exhibition of works by Lebanese painters and sculptors", later known as the Salon d'Automne, a juried open call exhibition showcasing contemporary Lebanese art. Notable Lebanese artists featured in Sursock's Salon throughout the 1960s include Chafic Abboud, Yvette Achkar, Etel adnan, Michel Basbous, Saloua Rawda Choucair, Paul Guiragossian, Eli Kanaan, Aref el Rayess and Adel Saghir.

After sharing the history of the museum, Director Karina walked us through another landmark BEYOND RUPTURES which takes the form of a historical timeline from 1952 until 2023 exploring three chronologies: that of Sursock museum, of its exhibitions, and of the significant local socio-political events, drawing parallels with the artistic production of the country. This exhibition, based on archives and documentation of rehabilitation works, identifies six interruptions throughout its 62 years of existence; from the first rupture between 1952 to 1961 which resulted in a legal battle to transform the residence of Nicholas Ibrahim Sursock into a Museum, to the most recent Beirut port blast on August 4, 2020.

This museum is a must see in the beautiful city of Beirut. The visit hardly scratched the surface because it can take hours to savor its beauty and give its history the credit it deserves. This beautiful evening culminated in the utmost spirit of fellowship with our club members and guests. The presence of Rotary Club Beirut Cedars President Ramzi Abu Samah, PP Joe Kanaan and Professor Kamal Kallab from Rotary Club Byblos added to the camaraderie of the evening.


Very often, life presents us with challenges and unexpected twists and turns that force us to dig deep and transform these challenges to strengths.
