On November 19, Rotary Club Beirut Cosmopolitan hosted Nancy Griffin, President of Rotary Club Picton in Canada as our guest speaker in an online meeting.

Nancy had an illustrious career with Proctor and Gamble in Toronto in finance and HR. In 1992, she was recruited to Private Client Wealth Management as a wealth advisor, then in 1994, she created Women, Worth and Wellness for her practice and business development, celebrating 30 years this year. She is a champion in women's leadership, personal health, wellness and wealth for positive impact in this world.



According to the McKinsey Health Institute, the gap between men's health and women's health remains wide, which directly affects everyone. Closing the health gap could boost the global economy by at least \$1 trillion annually by 2040.

Narrowing the health gap would lead to fewer early deaths, fewer health conditions, extended economic capacity to contribute and increased productivity. For every \$1 invested in women's health, about \$3 is projected in economic growth.

Our guest speaker further delved into Canadian women and philanthropy with donations from women increasing from \$1.5 billion in 2011 to \$4.3 billion in 2021. These donations are critical to the functioning of 86,000 Canadian Charities. Nancy cited two women role model philanthropists: Melinda Gates and Makenzie
