The evening culminated with a lovely dinner in a nature setting and with the utmost spirit of friendship and fellowship.













"How Covid has spurred a new interest in testing, and how testing can be critical to health, beyond Covid" On Tuesday September 27, RC Beirut Cosmopolitan hosted Dr. Anna Wang as a guest speaker on the important topic: Future of Testing, Lessons and Opportunities from the COVID Epidemic.

After two years of the world grappling with the Corona virus, its variants, the vaccines, the testing, Dr.Wang stated that till now the tests are not optimized to prevent viral transmission. As a preventive measure for all diseases, testing is the most important. Testing can lead to better detection and diagnosis, but it has its own challenges at the industry level: inaccuracies, quality control, invasiveness, result time and cost to name a few. The recommendation is to move testing to the Point of Care (PoC): ability to test anywhere(pharmacies, clinics, airports), more rapid, cost effective, ability to make treatment decisions faster.

Anna went on to identify disease frontiers for Point-Of -Care Diagnostics. The targeted diseases are: infectious diseases, oncology, antimicrobial drug resistance and inflammatory diseases. She states that 2/3 of cancers are curable when caught early. Trillion of dollars can be saved if diagnostic tools are in place to avert Dementia and Alzheimer diseases.

Dr. Wang summed up her presentation by saying that it all starts with testing.

- Testing can help contain an epidemic
- Testing can save lives
- Better tests are needed
- Innovative tests should be developed in a short time
- Cost and accessibility drive uptake
- Testing process needs innovation
- Tele-medicine is the future
- Testing is not everything but it's the START.

Lessons learned from the COVID epidemic... hope we learn for the future!


Fellowships Events
