The Lincoln Rotary Club is involved in many services to the community. Some of the highlights of our club activities were as follows:

This year, we had a joint venture with the Roseville Rotary Club and the sunset Rotary Club in sponsoring a "Career Fair" at Sierra Community College. We shared in one-third of the costs of approximately \$150 each club. We received many letters from the school districts, advisors and teachers complimenting us for a very worthwhile and successful project.

We conducted the first Annual Barbecue Dinner for the community's 4th of July celebration. We did this as part of the program to keep people home and not on the highways - the food was sold at cost - made no money. This was so successful we are holding it annually.

We sponsored the Senior Citizens Telephone Service for their new Civic Center Headquarters. We paid for installing the telephone and the monthly service charges (\$150).

We had a Y. E. S. student from Finland this year (approximately \$300). We have a Y. E. S. student candidate going to Australia this year.

We had a "Y. E. S. Day" at the Lincoln Rotary Club honoring those students in the district. Several stayed for the entire weekend (cost \$150).

Sponsored the outstanding high school student chosen to attend the Presidential Classroom in Washington, D.C. (cost \$250).

Presented a scholarship award to the Valedictorian of the graduating class at the high school (\$100).

Contributed \$100 toward the expense of an outstanding high school wrestler who was chosen to participate in a wrestling tour of the Orient.

Our club sponsored and financed the Sacramento Blood Bank visit to Lincoln twice this year. This has been a very successful project. Our members canvass the community for donors. Approximate cost to club (\$200 year).

We sponsor the Lincoln Boy Scout Troop and are assisting them in firework sales so they can use profits for local Scout projects.

We held an employer-employee relations day with all members bringing one or more of their employees.

We honored all faculty members of the Western Placer School District at a luncheon and all new teachers and staff were introduced to the community leaders (approximately \$250).

We had a fund raising project which was a "Buffalo Stew" and netted \$500.

Donated a "Meeting Plaque" to our new Rotary Club (South Yuba Linda) on their Charter Night (approximately \$50).

We also had ten new members join the Lincoln Club - we now have 55 members.

The Lincoln Club held a joint meeting with the Sunset Rotary Club which was very well attended.

Our main project has not been completed, but it will be this summer. It is a restroom for the Barbecue area at the McBean Park. We are sharing the labor and expenses with the local Lions Club. Lincoln Rotary Club share will be approximately \$500.

Lincoln Rotary Club is involved in Y. E. S. (Youth Exchange Service) program.

The Rotary Club of Lincoln has been actively involved in the Rotary Foundation for many years. The percentage standing of the club has increased to 1900% at present, a high rating near the top in this district. This represents contributions equal to \$10 per member for each 100% achieved. The Rotary Foundation contributions are used to fund many tremendously worthwhile activities sponsored by Rotary International: gratuate scholarships, vocational training, and other very wonderful opportunities offered to non-Rotarian applicants. We have not had the privilege, to date, of seeing a local individual take advantage of these opportunities. We now have our third exchange student with us, Silvia Rios from Giudad Obregon, Mexico. She will be here through June, 1976. Last year we had a lovely young lady, Katja Lundqvist, from Finland. Our previous student was Ubirajara de Macedo from Brazil. All of these youngsters have been excellent representatives of their countries and have endeared themselves to our hearts and the community. Again, we have not had the privilege of sending a student from this club to another country under Y. E. S. program, but, we are very hopeful this might be accomplished soon.

A Rotarian may become a Paul Harris Fellow as a result of contribution of \$1,000 to the Rotary Foundation. We have previously had two of our outstanding members presented this great honor. They are two of the charter members of this club. We were deeply saddened by the passing of one of these great men, Past District Governor Walter Jansen.
