
Tom Turriff Rides to End Polio







Our speaker today is Werkneh "Werkie" Ourga, a young man who was born in a small village in Ethiopia where there were no hospitals, electricity;

He walked 7 hours to the city to see doctors for the ten-pound tumors on his hands. Unable to receive treatment his dad dropped him off at Mother Teresa Orphanage - Home for Dying and Destitute, a place where desperate parents leave sick kids they can't care for in Ethiopia.

The doctors he saw wanted to amputate his hands in Ethiopia, but he was able to travel to the U.S.A where he had 15 surgeries to save his hands.

Werkneh stayed In the United States and graduated from Westlake High School. He received awards for being a great athlete and inspiring the students. He has spoken at Rotary ClubsWerkie Ourga.
