In addition to providing warmth, the project has facilitated excellent PR and recognition for the participating Rotary clubs. In 2023, Rotary clubs and other organizations will distribute nearly 15,000 hats and pairs of gloves to children and adults in their local communities.

As we continue this project, in its 31st year, we invite your club to participate. It's very easy ~ complete the commitment form below, and return it to the Rotary Club of Edina/Morningside with payment by September 15, 2023. The cost is \$18 per dozen (please order in quantities of 12 for each type of hat or pair of mittens).
