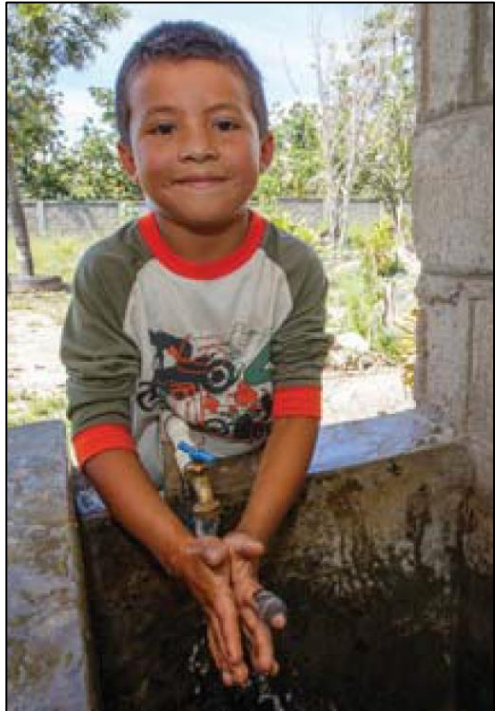

Why Honduras? The Need.

- One million people lack access to safe water.
- Few rural locations treat their water to make it safe.
- 1.6 million people do *not* have sanitation facilities.
- 600,000 people still practice open defecation.
- Waste water treatment is minimal.

Project Location: Western Honduras



Why partner with World Vision?

- 30 years of **experience** - successfully implementing 19 projects in Western Honduras.
- A national systematic **plan** for Honduras.
- Have **worked with Rotary** in the past.
- They have **people on the ground** in Honduras.
- They have pledged **\$400,000** to the project.

Safe Water Access Goals

- Build 15 gravity-fed residential water systems.
- Developing 1 mechanized/electric water system.
- Build water storage tanks in 24 schools.
- Develop a safe water supply in 2 health facilities.
- Educating 979 families on technologies to treat water @ home & handle it safely.

Sanitation Access Goals

- Building/improving sanitation blocks in 24 schools.
- Building 2 condominial sanitation sewer systems
- Constructing sanitation & hand washing facilities @ 11 health care facilities.
- Training 979 families on the benefits of basic sanitation and the importance of solid waste management.

Hygiene Promotion Goals

- Training 979 families and 24 schools in healthy hygiene practices.
- Organizing and training 24 school sanitation committees.

It will be Sustainable . . .

Activities will include training & reactivation of 22 WASH teams to manage, operate & maintain water systems & protect & manage watersheds.

Proof it works

In 2014, a similar project, at the same dollar amount, was lead by the Rotary Club of St. Louis Park. Through that project, 14,229 individuals gained access to a lasting source of clean water.
