PROCESS OF PROPOSING A NEW MEMBER

If you know of a person who would make a great Rotarian:

- Invite them to attend our club meetings as your guest. Introduce them as your guest.
- 2. Talk to them about Rotary. Encourage them to attend 2 or 3 meetings as your guest to see if they were a good fit with our club and if we are a good fit for them.
- 3. Complete a New Member Proposal Form and give it to the club Secretary or the club membership chair.
- 4. The Board of Directors will review and consider the proposal and vote on the proposed membership.
- 5. If approved, the applicants name will be announced to the club as a prospective member. The members have 7 days to submit an objection to the secretary in writing.
- 6. If there are no objections, an induction date is scheduled and a mentor is assigned to help further their introduction to Rotary.
