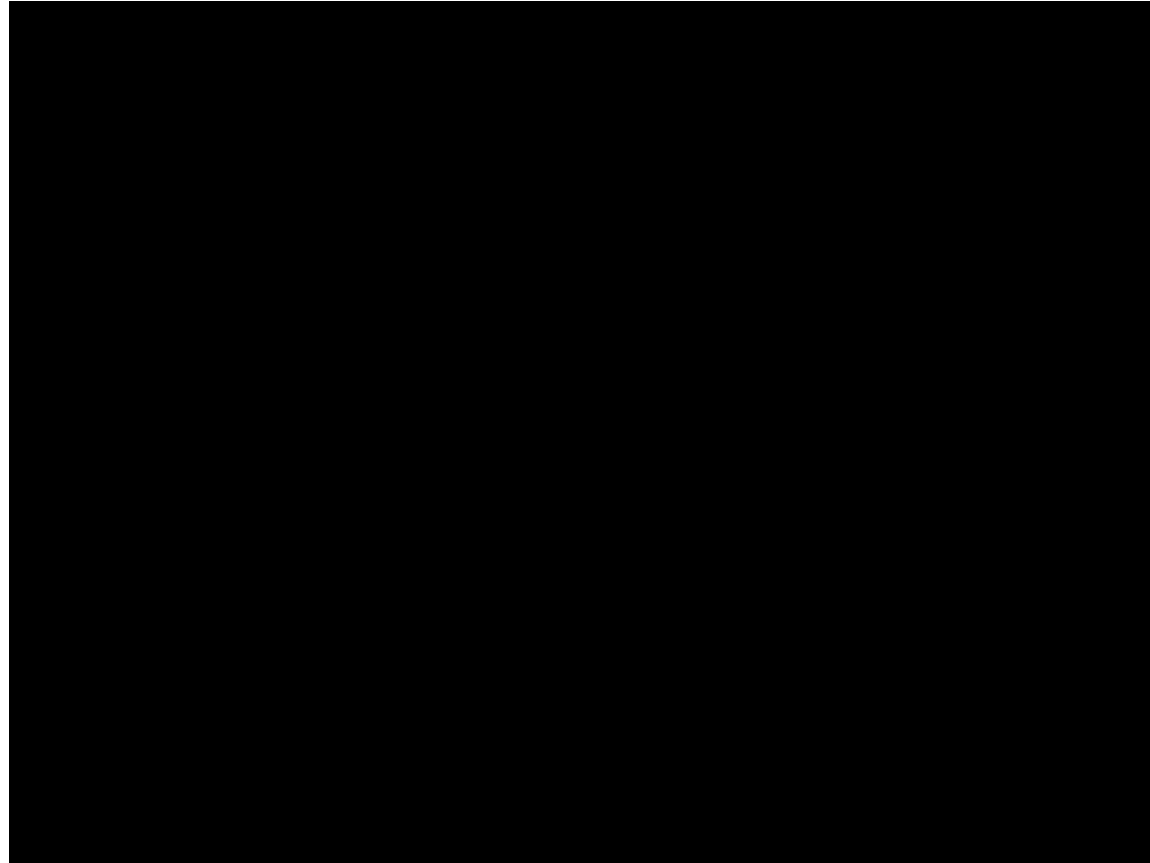
CLUB MEMBERSHIP GOALS
