

She handed out the annual report from the prior fiscal year and discussed many ways the foundation helps other nonprofits and community organizations. This year is the 25th anniversary of WCCF. Big thanks to many of the donors in the room and the other fundraising professionals in the room.

By showing a video that highlighted 25 years of service across 7 counties and the mission to raise funds to benefit the residents within those counties, the vision was cast of honoring the past, connecting community now and "dreaming forward." The video also explained the logo and its symbolism. The grants, endowments and scholarships supported by donors help many each year to advance their education. to improve their living conditions and to serve the community as well. The logo is a circle; represents a sense of community and a connection to others. The spiral represents the power of endowments; a permanent gift that keeps on giving. The petroglyph symbolizes those who came before us and have left their

mark. Looking back we honor and celebrate our founders who had the vision for a homegrown charitable foundation

By connecting donors who care to causes that matter our community foundation has been helping others leave their mark across Western Colorado for the past 25 years. Many of our endowments now supply full annual funding for a number of programs throughout our communities.
