Debra Menger got interested in Curling about ten years ago at the young age of 60 when she went to Telluride to take a class on curling. She saw that it was not very physical, so she thought she might have a chance. And when she heard the rocks hit each other for the first time in addition to the yelling, she was hooked. For a long time, there has been a debate over the origins of curling. Some say the game started in Scotland while others say Netherlands. Recent archeological evidence, though, discovered the earliest Curling stones came from Scotland in 1511. The first documented evidence of Curling was a 1570s painting from the Netherlands. In 1711, the first Curling Club started in Scotland. From there it was brought to the Americas. In 1998, it became an Olympic Sport, though it was a demonstration sport in 1924. In the game of curling, two teams with four people each throw 44-pound stones just under 150 feet down a sheet of ice at 12-foot target. The team closest to the center wins that round. People sweep in front of the stone to help it slide and influence its course. The stones are handmade from Scotland. RiverCity Sports Plex is now doing Curling and invites people to participate. A "Learn to Curl" class is coming up on March 17th if interested.
