Lee Borden - Introduced Jade Beecham, Volunteer Coordinator for Karis (today's guest speaker)

Jade spoke at length about the mission of Karis and the many programs there. The House, Laurel House, The Eidsness Center (street outreach). When youtube stay in the 18-24 age housing for up to two years, part of their income is directed to the program and then returned to the individual for independent housing deposit etc. when they move out on their own.

Laurel House is transitional housing from age 24 up and can help with transitions through many different types of challenges including on-site counseling.

Drop in Center - below the Look on Main optometry shop. Laundry and lots of other drop-in resources.

There is a large amount of information about Karis online as well and the school district estimates there are about 800 unhoused youth locally at the present time.

Aaron Tice presented the speaker with a certificate for a donation in her name towards the effort to eradicate polio.
