Paul DiMarchi introduced our speaker Tom Walch of Grand Valley Power (GVP).

Tom Walch loved talking about GVP, an electricity distribution cooperative. It is the largest cooperative electric company in the state. GVP buys electricity and distribute it to their rural and suburban customers in Mesa County. The serve one out of every ten meters in our community. GVP is a member-owned and directed organization. Electric cooperatives were organized in the New Deal to help serve rural areas of the nation (which did not have electricity at the time). It is a model that

has served the nation ever since. Today, 48% of the power they deliver come from renewable energy, one of the best marks in the state. Examples of some of GVP's innovations is solar farms, such as the one on 29 Road, specifically set up to help low-income homes. That Rotarian. project has been replicated by other utilities across the country. GVP has also introduced broad time-ofuse rates to make utility bills more equitable. In addition, GVP works
