After an early career in advertising and marketing, she spent 12 years as a stay-athome mom and found herself volunteering to raise money for Holy Family School. Once she discovered how rewarding that was, she landed her first job as Director of Fundraising for United Way. She followed that with fundraising for the Mesa County Library Foundation, the Museums of Western Colorado, and Habitat for Humanity. She is currently Major Gifts Director for St. Mary's Hospital Foundation.

Her fundraising brought her to serve on the boards for The American Cancer Society, Colorado West Land Trust (President), the Wayne Aspinall Foundation (President), The Mesa County Historical Society (President), The Colorado National Monument Association and River's Edge West. It is also what brought her to co-chair the Legends of the Grand Valley Historic Sculpture Project for 13 years.

Outside of the Legends Project, the most cherished (and somewhat quirky) adventures have been flying with Gateway Canyons Air Tours, being a tour guide for Eagle Tree Tours, managing the Thunder Mountain Pipe Band and - most of all living the life of a mother and grandmother! 
