### Increase in RI, District, and Club Dues

Both Rotary International and Rotary District #5470 are increasing their dues starting July 1st. Together, this will be a \$7.50 increase in your annual dues.

Likewise, the Rotary Club of Grand Junction Board of Directors voted to also increase dues by \$4.50 per year starting July 1st. This was deemed necessary to meet the increased cost of operation. In addition, the Club has not increased its due in over a decade.

So, in your next quarterly dues, you will see a slight increase of \$3.00 per quarter. Again, increasing costs makes this move necessary and it has been a while since we have increased our dues. Thank you for understanding.

- President-Elect Nominee (to serve 2025-26) three new Board members



### The Pledge of Allegiance is led by Dale Beede.


The Ready-for-Anytime singer, accompanied by Hugh Plumleigh, led the Club in Yankee Doodle Dandy and Happy Trails.
