Additionally, the club organizes service projects, social events, and outdoor activities.

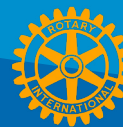

Youth and Literacy: Telluride Rotary participates in Rotary Youth Exchange, awards scholarships to high school seniors, sponsors the high school Interact service club, gives dictionaries to all county third-graders, and funds the local branch of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library that supplies free books monthly to children age 0 to 5.

Community Service: Telluride Rotary does hands-on volunteering for local causes and partners with other regional groups for educational forums and service.

International Service: Telluride Rotary funds and raises awareness about service projects worldwide. Our club has supported initiatives such as maternal health in western Panama and Northern Uganda, girls’ education in Kenya, the Shelter Box disaster relief charity, and End Polio Now.
