**Program:** Roger Gordon, Supervisor, Jordan River National Fish Hatchery, part of US Fish and Wildlife Service. It has been in service since the early 60’s. Usually they raise Lake Trout for the Great Lakes, but now are raising 1,000,000 trout for the Great Lakes and another million fish for another hatchery. They also raise 1.1 million Cisco and 9000 14” Brook Trout. All total 3.1 million fish are raised every year. Roger spoke about the various fish populations, increasing and decreasing, as a plan for the future stocking of the Great Lakes with what kind of fish to stock in which lake. Some are replacements for dwindling food sources for the larger commercial fish. Roger also spoke about his effluent treatment project. The Hatchery is allowed to discharge 2000 lbs. of phosphorus every year into the Jordan River, the Hatchery is down to 180 lbs. in 2018. He is meeting his internal goal of less than 1000 lbs. per year.
