### WHO ARE THE FACULTY?

Faculty members are carefully selected by the Institute for their teaching abilities. They are drawn from all over the Northeast Rotary region and beyond. Each new faculty member must attend an initial all day training program and periodic reorientation programs The results of course evaluations help us to improve course content and facilitation.
