Rotary Day of Service

On Saturday, May 20, 2023, more than 500 Rotary clubs and 14,000 Rotarians across 6 states and 3 countries, from Connecticut to Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Pennsylvania, New York, and New Jersey in the United States, plus the countries of Bermuda and Brazil, will volunteer in their communities for an unprecedented Rotary Day of Service, collecting clothing and food for the homeless and less fortunate, refurbishing parks, and much more.

The Secaucus Rotary Club, working with Mayor Mike Gonnelli and Kimberly McCleary of the Secaucus Environmental Department, chose to do a clean-up at the Mill Creek Marsh Trail for their Rotary Day of Service project. Due to Saturday's rain, the Club pushed the project to Sunday and had a perfect day. Kimberly provided all the necessary supplies, like gloves, bags, and the tools to pick up the trash.

Volunteers from the Club and students from the Secaucus High School Rotary Interact Club walked the trail, picking up trash and cleaning up the grounds to beautify this area for the enjoyment of all the residents of Secaucus, and anyone else who visits. Club President Rob Merlo, Project Chairs Rick Saltarelli and Diane Rich, and other Club members said that there really wasn't a lot of trash to pick up, saying that it shows what a great job the town already does in keeping this area beautiful for those who come here to take a stroll, jog, or take their dogs for a walk along the trail. Some of the members, even those residing in Secaucus, said they did not even know this area existed. But they all said it won't be their last visit.
