The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

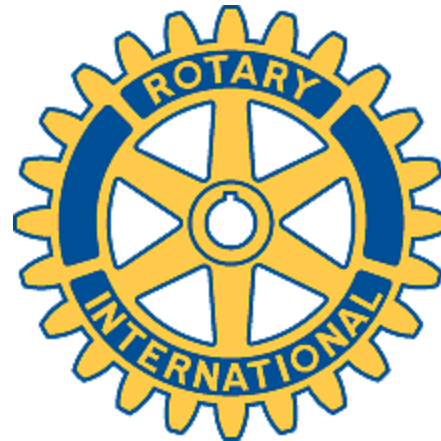
FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

Rotary is an organization of business and professional leaders united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world. In 166 countries worldwide, approximately 1.2 million Rotarians belong to more than 30,000 Rotary Clubs.

Rotary club membership represents a cross-section of the community's business and professional men and women. The world's Rotary clubs meet weekly and are nonpolitical, nonreligious, and open to all cultures, races, and creeds.

The main objective of Rotary is service — in the community, in the workplace, and throughout the world. Rotarians develop community service projects that address many of today's most critical issues, such as children at risk, poverty and hunger, the environment, illiteracy, and violence. They also support programs for youth, educational opportunities and international exchanges for students, teachers, and other professionals, and vocational and career development.

Did you know that the Wyckoff-Midland Park Rotary Club

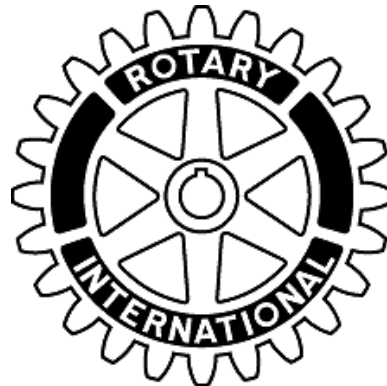
- awards over \$16,000 in scholarships each year to graduating seniors from the towns of Wyckoff and Midland Park?

GIFT OF LIFE

The Gift of Life is one of Rotary's most heart-warming activities. Started in 1986, Gift of Life is a program that gives children with potentially fatal heart conditions the opportunity to receive appropriate medical attention

Coming from around the world, these children usually need an operation but their families have neither the access to nor the financial ability to afford it. While in the United States the child and parent stay with a Rotary Family.

The Wyckoff-Midland Park Rotary Club is proud to have sponsored several children. The Club covers the child's medical expenses; the host family and the club cover the family's other expenses while in the States.



THE 4-WAY TEST

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is *The 4-Way Test*. It asks the following four questions:

"Of the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"

MEMBERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

- Members are expected to attend weekly programs of the club. Opportunities to make up attendance include attending the regular meeting of another Rotary club, attending various other Rotary meetings, or attending a club service project authorized by the club board of directors.
- Members are required to pay annual dues to their clubs, their districts, and to Rotary International.
- Members are expected to participate in local or international activities or projects of the Rotary club.
- Clubs encourage members to aspire to leadership or committee roles within their clubs.
