



Are You a Paul Harris Fellow?

Rotary trivia. Who is Paul Harris? He was actually the founder of the first Rotary Club in 1905, which grew into today's Rotary International. The Rotary Foundation supports Rotary's many programs and areas of focus through its annual fund. Contributions to the fund are invested for three years to generate earnings. After that, 50% of the contribution is returned to the respective Rotary district for its own designated projects. Some of that money comes back to support our Park City Rotary Club.

The Paul Harris Fellow recognition acknowledges individuals who contribute, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation. The club may also contribute points to an individual where one point equals \$1. Recognition is subsequently given for each additional \$1,000 contribution.

Each of our Rotarians has a great opportunity For the next month (actually ending October 31). In order to promote Foundation giving, for those individuals who are within \$400 of their next level of recognition, the club will match any contribution up to \$200 with points. Thus any individual who is \$400 short of their next level can get 200 points with a \$200 contribution (400 credits) and thus obtain the next level of recognition. An individual who is \$50 short of their next level could also give \$200, get 200 points, and be \$150 toward their future next level.

To make it easy for club members to contribute they can either make out a check to The Rotary Foundation and give or mail the check to Hamilton Easter, (PO Box 99, Park City, UT 84060) or send an email to Hamilton Easter, indicating the amount of the contribution and requesting it be placed on the next monthly Rotary bill. Check in with Hamilton with any questions.



The Park City Rotary Club's Fall Candidate Forum will feature Summit County Council candidates Malena Stevens and Roger Armstrong. Each are running for separate seats unopposed. The forum will focus on their views of countywide issues. It will be moderated and carried live on KPCW. The forum is planned for our regular Zoom meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 29. July


 Assembled over 400 snack packs for Wasatch County children in need.
