

RBFM--- A Community Resource

Last week's speaker was Tammy Iskarous of River Bend Family Ministries. RBFM is located on Ferguson in Wood River providing a variety of services to help people to become selfsufficient.

Tammy says that most of their clients need their services because of drugs or abuse. RBFM offers them counseling, parenting classes, child advocacy (CASA), violence counseling (RAVEN), life-skill classes, and similar services. RBFM is also the home of Riverbend Youth on Fire and Options Now Peace Ministry.

No one at RBFM receives a salary, not even Tammy. They have six client service counselors plus the various service providers. Last year there were over 1700 clents served with 58,000 volunteer hours. 87% of all money raised goes directly to services provided.

Funding for RBFM comes primarily through donations and through fund-raising events like their annual Trivia night. They have a board of directors of community leaders and can be found online at www.riverbendministries.com.

Free Money

Our guest two weeks ago was Illinois State Treasurer, Dan Rutheford. Dan has served as treasurer since 2011. Before that, he served ten years in the Illinois House of Representatives and two terms in the Illinois Senate.

Dan talked to the club about I-Cash. He said that \$1.6 billion of unclaimed money is held with the state treasurer. These funds come from many sources including estates that were not cleared and gift cards that were never cashed. About 20% of people who check with I-Cash will find that they are due something. \$21 million belongs to residents of Madison County. To check your status go to www.treasurer.il.gov and follow the link to I-Cash.

Dan also spoke to the club about the Illinois Debt Crisis. Illinois' debt crisis is the worst in the nation and its unemployment is the worst in the mid-west. The problem is due to the unfunded pension funds for the state creating an unmanagable liability. Dan says if something

does not change soon, the pension fund will soon absorb all state revenues. For instance, that last 67% tax increases did not go to pay unpaid bills, but to pay for public pensions. Dan says the State Legislature is not addressing the issue and should be held to account.

Making Schools Green

On January 10, our guest was Ann Linenfelser who came at the invitation of Virgil Moore. Ann has been involved in Madison County as the recycling coordinator for Madison County Schools since 1990 which is now known as the Green Schools Coordinator.

Over the years, Ann has promoted recycling and sustainability in our schools leading to broad-based recycling including shoes, eyeglasses, keys, tab tops, aluminium cans, plastic bags, gift cards, holiday lights, milk and juice boxes, cell phones, and batteries.

The current initative is to compost food left over from meals. East Alton is one of the pilot schools that signed on early and has developed a regular method for composting. "If it comes from the earth, it goes back to the earth."
