ALL THE NEWS

LAST WEEK, JIM SCHRADER, THE PUBLISHER OF THE TELEGRAPH WAS ON HAND TO ANSWER ALL THE QUESTIONS WE COULD THROW AT HIM. JIM IS A NATIVE OF THE METRO AREA AND HAS SPENT THE LAST 30 YEARS IN NEWSPAPERS. HE HAS HELD HIS CURRENT POSITION SINCE 1998. RATHER THAN COME WITH A PREPARED SCRIPT HE PREFERRED THAT WE "SOUND OFF" TO HIM. NORMALLY A STORY IS WRITTEN BY A REPORTER WHO GIVES IT TO A COPY EDITOR FOR REVIEW AND FACT CHECKING. THE STORY IS THEN GIVEN TO ANOTHER EDITOR WHO REVIEWS IT AND GIVES IT A HEADLINE. JIM POINTED OUT THAT HEADLINE WRITING IS QUITE A SKILL AND, MORE OFTEN THAN NOT, PAPERS ARE SUED FOR LIBEL FOR A HEADLINE RATHER THAN THE BODY OF A STORY. IN A NUTSHELL, JIM DESCRIBES HIS JOB AS THE CEO OF THE PAPER. THE TELEGRAPH IS CURRENTLY OWNED BY FREEDOM COMMUNICATION OF IRVINE, CALIFORNIA. JIM IS A RELUCTANT FAN OF THE INTERNET BUT UNDERSTANDS THAT IT'S A MUST. HE SUGGESTED THAT ANY NEWSPAPER THAT SAYS IT MAKES MONEY ON THE INTERNET IS USING CREATIVE BOOKKEEPING. THE TELEGRAPH RECEIVES 1.6 MILLION PAGE VIEWS A MONTH. THAT'S GREAT, BUT DOES REQUIRE CONSTANT UPDATING BY A NEWSROOM STAFFER. AFTER PAGE 1, THE SECOND MOST VIEWED PAGE IS THE OBITS. THE ADVENT OF THE INTERNET MEANS THAT THE NEWSPAPER HAS LOST CASUAL SUBSCRIBERS, BUT HAS ALLOWED A GLOBAL ACCESS TO THE NEWSPAPER. JIM SUGGESTS THAT THE THE DEMISE OF NEWSPAPERS HAVE BEEN PREDICTED SINCE THE DAWN OF TELEVISION. HE SEES PAPERS BEING AROUND A LONG TIME, BUT PROBABLY WITH SHORTER STORIES THAT ARE LINKED TO ONLINE CONTENT. HE SPENT A FEW MINUTES REVIEWING THE HISTORY OF THE NEWSPAPER IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE SALE BY THE COUSLEY FAMILY IN 1985. IT WAS AN INTERESTING TIME, INCLUDING FINANCING TIED WITH MICHAEL MILKEN. JIM POINTED OUT THAT THE ST. LOUIS POST-DISPATCH HAS THE DISTINCTION OF BEING THE ONLY NEWSPAPER IN A SINGLE METRO MARKET THAT DOES NOT HAVE 50% PENETRATION. HE EXPLAINED THE FEDERAL LAW THAT ALLOWED THE NEWHOUSE PUBLISHING HOUSE TO CLOSE THE GLOBE DEMOCRAT IN 1986 AND DRAW PROFITS FROM THE POST-DISPATCH UNTIL 2012. IT'S NOT LIKELY THAT ST. LOUIS WILL EVERY SEE A SECOND DAILY PAPER. ON A LIGHTER NOTE, JIM IS IMPRESSED BY THE NUMBER OF CALLS THAT COME IN TO SOUND OFF AT 2 A.M. YOU CAN ALWAYS TELL WHO IS TRANSCRIBING THE CALLS BY THEIR BODY LANGUAGE. WE THANK JIM FOR TAKING THE TIME TO SHARE HIS

RI president helps charter Korean American club District 6440 has a new club, in part due to the recruiting prowess of RI President Dong Kurn Lee. Lee presented the club charter to the Rotary Club of Chicagoland Korean-Northbrook with District 6440 Governor Pamela Kerr on 22 August in Northbrook, Illinois. Attendees were asked to make a \$50 donation to Rotary's \$100 Million Challenge. About 175 people attended the charter night and the event raised \$6,000.

The club's 54 members are Korean American, and club business will mostly be conducted in Korean. But that is the beauty of Rotary, Lee told the charter night audience. "What matters in Rotary is not what language we speak, or where we come from, or how much English we remember from high school," Lee said. "What matters in Rotary is fellowship, friendship, and building bridges of goodwill." District leaders spoke with members of the Rotary Club of Korea Town-Los Angeles to get an idea of how a Korean club would fit into their district. "We think it will bring people into Rotary who would not have joined Rotary otherwise," says Mike Yesner, assistant governor coordinator for District 6440. Club president Sung Wun Kim says it is an honor to join Rotary during Lee's year as RI president and that Lee is an invaluable asset to the club. "I cannot really explain how much he has helped us," Kim says. "It's tremendous how much he is supporting us and encouraging us to do service work." Kim says the new club is getting organized, and members are getting to know each other. Eventually, the club hopes to do service projects in the Korean community, raise funds for polio eradication, and work with other clubs in the district on combined projects. Lee asked district governors to bring two new clubs into Rotary this year as part of his ambitious membership goals. The Rotary clubs of Northbrook, Skokie Valley, Evanston Lighthouse, and Korea Town-Los Angeles sponsored the new club.
