ILLINOIS. THE CVB HAD A VERY BUSY FIRST QUARTER AND ARE IN THE MIDST OF PROMOTING THE SPRING TOURIST SEASON. SHE POINTED OUT THAT THIS SEASON IS SLOWER THAT THE OTHERS. PRIMARILY BECAUSE THERE IS NO FOCAL EVENT OR ACTIVITY TO BRING FOLKS TO THE AREA. THE CVB HAS DEVELOPED A CAMPAIGN ENTITLED "7 SAVORY SINS" TO HELP GENERATE TOURIST INTEREST. THE CIRCULAR WAS RECENTLY SENT TO 10,000 FOLKS ON THE CVB MAILING LIST. WHAT ARE THESE "SINS" YOU ASK? FEAST, INDULGE, PROCRASTINATE, STARE, CONQUER, REBEL AND LOUNGE. THE CATCH TITLE IS OBVIOUSLY DESIGNED TO GRAB THE ATTENTION OF THE TOURIST AND NOT TO IMPLY ANYTHING RELIGIOUS. THE CAMPAIGN HIGHLIGHTS OPPORTUNITIES TO-DINE, SHOP, BIKE, BIRD WATCH, GEOCACHE, SEGWAY TOURS AND HAVING A SIP AT THE LOCAL WINERIES. THE CVB IS ALSO SPONSORING A SUMMER GETAWAY GIVEAWAY CONTEST. IN HONOR OF THE SESQUICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION OF THE LINCOLN-DOUGLAS DEBATES, THE CVB HAS 5 RELATED EVENTS SCHEDULED THIS WEEKEND. THERE WILL BE AT LEAST 85 LINCOLN IMPERSONATORS IN TOWN TO JOIN IN THE EVENTS, SUZANNE PROUDLY POINTED OUT THAT THE BYWAY WAS NAMED ONE OF THE 7 WONDERS OF ILLINOIS. SHE REMINDED US THAT THE BEST TOURIST EXPERIENCE HAPPENS WHEN ALL COMMUNITIES ARE INVOLVED. IF YOU ARE AWARE OF ANY COMMUNITY EVENTS THAT A TOURIST MAY BE INTERESTED IN, LET THE CVB KNOW SO THAT IT CAN BE PLACED ON ITS CALENDAR. SUZANNE POINTED OUT THAT ROBERT WADLOW STILL HAS A SPECIAL ATTRACTION FOR TOURISTS. THE ONE PROBLEM THAT MANY TOURISTS **ENCOUNTER IS THE SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF BUSINESSES** THAT ARE CLOSED ON MONDAY, NOTHING DISAPPOINTS A TOURIST MORE THAN THE INABILITY TO SEE OR DO THINGS THAT THEY WANT TO DO WHILE THEY ARE IN TOWN. Rotary in Cuba

The first Rotary club to be organized outside an English-speaking country was established in Havana, Cuba, 29 April 1916, with 22 charter members. The club was admitted to Rotary on 1 June 1916. During 1923, the Rotary Club of Havana celebrated its seventh anniversary, in what became a very busy year. The club sponsored a carnival attended by more than 1,500 children, won a prohibition against bullfighting in Cuba, worked to get the city's water sanitized and properly purified, and obtained pavement repairs in certain areas. By the time the RI Convention was held in Havana, 9-14 June 1940, 42 of the 48 clubs that had been chartered in Cuba were still active. Another 20 clubs would be chartered there after, ending with the Rotary Club of San Cristobal, on 16 October 1957.
