Madison County Fun Facts

Erin's guest two weeks ago was Madison County Clerk, Mark Von Nida who talked about one aspect of his job and a bit of history of Madison County.

Mark is in his fifth term as County Clerk and faces reelection every four years. One of his important duties is to serve as the Chief Elections Official for the county. Each election, local, state, or national,

requires him to mobolize 1200 temporary employees who work in 189 locations among the 225 "branch offices" that service the election. These workers will begin their day at 5 a.m. and finish after the ballots are balanced and reported sometime after the polls close at 7 p.m.

There are 10,000 election jurisdictions in the United States, each having to perform its work flawlessly to certify an election. Madison County was one of the first to abandon the old punch card system which had an error rate of 7% and to embrace the optical readers which has an error rate of less than .5%.

Mark also noted that Madison County will celebrate its Bicentennial on Sept. 12 of this year. The county is actually older than the state of Illinois and is the site of a great deal of interesting history, including the beginning of the Lewis and Clark venture and the Indian massacre of 1814.
