# Don't Worry, Be Healthy!

Dr. Paul (Hoover) was in the house last week as our distinguished speaker. He was anxious to finish his discussion on ways to live a healthy life.

Paul discussed the difference in approach to medicine and health expressed in two camps: vitalism and mechanism. Mechanism thinks of the body as a machine with various parts and functions. If something goes wrong with the system, you fix it with surgery, a pill, or some other form of therapy. In vitalism, the body is seen as a system that expresses the entire function of your life. Physical problems are symptomatic of larger life and behavioral issues that should be addressed in a more global way.

Paul suggests that we look at the issue of good health from a vitalistic point of view. Good health is about managing your life in such a way as to maintain your body and your life at peak performance. Believing that the body has an innate ability to heal itself, good health is a result of providing the best environment for the body to perform its best functions. As demonstrated with placebo testing, recovery from illness is produced as effectively from "a reasonable expectation of getting better" as from any specific pharmaceutical.

Dr. Paul's prescription for a vital and healthy life: eat properly, exercise (1 hour every day), rest, and manage stress.

"We are excited about this new partnership with Uppsala University to take the Rotary Peace Centers program to the next level," says Foundation Trustee Chair Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammar. "We are confident that our Rotary Peace Fellow alumni, actively engaged in peace- building and conflict prevention and resolution around the world, will agree that partnering with Uppsala University to host a Rotary	r Peace Center is a winning strategy." Uppsala University has an established two-year master's program in peace and conflict studies and a research program led by a large, internationally recognized faculty. The Uppsala Conflict Data Program is a leader in the field and will provide future Rotary Peace Fellows with the opportunity to combine informed theory with data-driven field research.
