WHEN IT'S TIME TO GO

LAST WEEK WE HAD THE PLEASURE OF HEARING FROM TERI SABO, PATIENT CARE MANAGER AT ALTON MEMORIAL. TERI'S BACKGROUND IS IN ONCOLOGY, BUT SHE WAS WITH US IN HER CAPACITY AS A COMMUNITY NURSE. ONE OF THE MOST



CRITICAL DECISIONS THAT WE WILL EVER BE FACED WITH IS, WHEN IT IS TIME TO RELOCATE TO A CARE FACILITY, EITHER FOR YOURSELF OR A RELATIVE? SHE TOLD US THAT THE NUMBER ONE DRIVER IN THIS PROCESS SHOULD BE SAFETY. ARE YOU SAFE IN YOUR HOME, IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD? HOME SAFETY CAN BE SOMETHING AS SEEMINGLY SIMPLE AS NAVIGATING A SET OF STAIRS. OTHER QUALITY OF LIFE ISSUES THAT NEED TO BE CONSIDERED ARE THE ABILITY TO WALK, SEE AND DRIVE. TERI POINTED OUT THAT THERE IS A GROWING MOVEMENT IN THE U.S WHERE NEIGHBORS BAN TOGETHER TO HELP EACH OTHER WITH EVERYDAY TASKS: TRIPS TO THE DOCTOR, GROCERY, COOKING, CLEANING, YOU GET THE PICTURE. THE SERVICE IS USUALLY PROVIDED FREE AND IS DESIGNED TO KEEP PEOPLE IN THEIR HOMES AS LONG AS POSSIBLE. THERE ARE ALSO AGENCIES THAT WILL PROVIDE IN HOME CARE FOR A FEE. THE HOURLY COST RANGES FROM \$14-\$24. THESE HOME CARE PROFESSIONAL CAN PROVIDE A RANGE OF SERVICES, BUT ANY RISKS THAT ARE ASSOCIATED WITH LIVING AT HOME DON'T GO AWAY.ONCE THE DECISION HAS BEEN MADE TO MOVE, THE CHALLENGES BECOME MORE COMPLEX. THE CHOICES INCLUDE: INDEPENDENT LIVING COMMUNITY, SUPPORTIVE LIVING COMMUNITY, ASSISTED LIVING COMMUNITY AND NURSING HOME CARE. NURSING HOMES PROVIDE LONG TERM CARE AND ALZHEIMER'S CARE. TERI TOLD US THAT, EVEN THOUGH THE FACILITIES MAY HAVE THE SAME "COMMUNITY" TITLE, THE FACILITIES' LEVEL OF SERVICE MAY VARY CONSIDERABLY BETWEEN INSTITUTIONS. THE COST OF THESE FACILITIES CAN RANGE FROM \$1000-\$7000 PER MONTH. TERI PASSED OUT A CHART THAT COMPARED EACH LEVEL OF CARE, A SHEET INCLUDING DEFINITIONS FOR THE DIFFERENT LEVELS OF CARE, A BUDGET WORKSHEET AND A LIST OF RESOURCES LINKS. SHE ALSO POINTED OUT THAT MOST PEOPLE WANT TO STAY AT HOME. THE BIGGEST DOWNSIDE TO THIS IS THE LOSS OF SOCIAL CONNECTIONS. THIS LOSS USUALLY LEADS TO FAILING HEALTH. IF STAYING AT HOME IS THE CHOICE, THERE ARE OPTIONS SUCH AS "LIFELINE" THAT CAN PROVIDE AN EMERGENCY RESPONSE WHEN ACTIVATED. IT'S IMPORTANT TO DO YOUR HOMEWORK BEFORE MAKING ANY MOVE. IF YOU SEE ANYTHING LIKE THIS IN YOUR FUTURE IT'S NEVER TO EARLY TO START THE GROUNDWORK. WE THANK TERL FOR SHARING THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND SERIOUS FOOD FOR THOUGHT. IT HAPPENED TODAY

1070: Roquefort cheese discovered

1992: The US Postal Service announced the results of a nationwide vote on the Elvis Presley stamp, saying more people preferred the "younger Elvis" design. Pakistan moves to end polio in the face of conflict

PAKISTANI EFFORT CONTINUES

Pakistan's effort to eradicate polio is moving ahead, despite the displacement of up to one million people by the military conflict in the country's North-West Frontier Province. Among the positive developments reported by the World Health Organization:

- * As of 19 May, nine immunization teams had vaccinated almost 17,900 children under age five on the three main transit routes out of the conflict zone.
- * More than 87,000 displaced people are living in 26 camps in the province. Mobile teams have gone tent to tent to immunize 6,890 children and are deployed at registration points to vaccinate newcomers.
- * Almost 870,000 people -- about 90 percent of the total displaced population -- have registered as living with relatives or friends. Immunization teams are being trained to cover communities hosting displaced families to ensure that the children are vaccinated against polio and receive vitamin A supplements during National Immunization Days (NIDs) 28-30 May. Subnational Immunization Days are scheduled for 22-24 June.

WHO officials say it is vital to reach children of displaced families, because access to these children has been hampered by the poor security situation in the province. To promote the upcoming NIDs, aimed at reaching 33 million children nationally, Rotarians and social workers joined a walk against polio in Karachi on 21 May, led by the city's deputy mayor, Nasreen Jalil. "After the walk, the deputy mayor gave polio drops to kids and appealed to all citizens to participate," says Aziz Memon, a member of the Rotary Club of Karachi, Sind, and past governor of District 3270 (Afghanistan; Pakistan). "Because of the presence of the deputy mayor, the event was covered by all print and electronic media and will create a lot of awareness."
