New School for Columbia

Last week Wendell told the story of how he became aware of the need for rebuilding a school in Barranquilla.

Barranquilla is a city of 2.2 million people on the northern end of Columbia. The shool that Wendell visited is licensed by the government, but receives no funding. Everyone involved in it is a volunteer, including the teacher. This school is located in the poorest outskirts of the city and provides the only opportunity for education for the children of the area.

Upon visiting the school, Wendell was shown all of the ways that the building needs repair. In fact, it is in too poor of a condition to be repaired and should be replaced. He has begun working through Rotary clubs in Barranquilla and in the US to try to raise funds for building a new school. Approximately \$23,000 is needed and this is not the kind of project that Rotary International will match funds for.
