Preserving our Green-space

Last week Mark S. introduced his guest, Alley Ringhausen, who is the executive director of the Great Rivers Land Trust. The trust is "dedicated to preserving scenic beauty and preserving wildlife habitat for future generations." The Land trust came into existence in 1992 and Alley has been the director since 2000. Its focus is on the confluence region, including the Illinois, Missouri, and Mississippi rivers and the surrounding habitat.

Through the trust, acreage is acquired through various means and given protected status. Over 4000 acres of land along the rivers is protected, meaning that they cannot be used for development. Often these lands are donated back to a landowner who will preserve their status for future generations. These lands are often used for recreational or research purposes, but are kept in their natural state.

Private foundations have donated all the money used for the purchase of lands. Through the trust, several projects have been completed which have preserved or restored the lands adjacent to the rivers in order to retain their unique beauty. Among those projects has been restoration of a lake at the boy scout camp and purchase of property near Raging Rivers known as the Palisades.
