Just One Shift

Adam King came at the invitation of Lori P. last week to talk to the club about Wine to Water. Adam has two bachelors degrees from SIUE and is working on two Masters degrees. To earn a living, he tends bar in Alton.

One day, Adam read a book by Doc Hendley telling his story of the need for clean water in third-world countries. Hinley's approach is to involve local residents in the process of building the wells so that they know how to repair it if it fails. Working with Samaritan's Purse, Hendley has devised several approaches to providing access to clean water for people in these countries.

Following the example of Gaz Regan, Adam decided to organize local bartenders to give their tips from "Just One Shift" to Hinley's organization. He recruited area bartenders to do the same and wound up raising \$5100 from twenty-six bartenders in eighteen bars. The dollars raised through this project went to Uganda.

Adam said that one-third of all hospital beds in the world are filled by people who have water-related illness. Next year, Adam hopes to expand the number of bars and bartenders involved. More information is available at winetowater.org.

NEWS, NOTES, AND NONSENSE



\$500K for Somolia

Rotary has approved a \$500,000 Rapid Response grant to the World Health Organization (WHO) to address a recent polio outbreak in Somalia. The outbreak occurred in the Banadir region of Somalia, where a large number of children had not been vaccinated against polio due to inaccessibility.

As of 14 August, 110 cases of wild poliovirus have been reported in the Horn of Africa—100 cases in Somalia and 10 in Kenya. This is the first outbreak in Somalia since 2007 and in Kenya since 2011.

The Rotary grant will cover operational costs, including

human resources, training, and transportation of health workers, aimed at immunizing children under 10 in all accessible areas of Somalia in August.

To date, five vaccination campaigns have been held in Somalia, three in Kenya, two each in Ethiopia and Yemen, and one in Djibouti. Additional campaigns are planned through the end of the year.

Drawing on lessons learned from previous polio outbreaks, the first vaccination campaign was carried out within a week after the first case was confirmed.

"Until polio transmission is interrupted in the endemic countries, outbreaks such as the one in Somalia are to be expected," says Dr. Hamid Jafari, director of Polio Research and Operations at WHO. "So long as the budget for the new Polio Eradication and **Endgame Strategic** Plan is fully funded, we're well-equipped to pursue endemic and outbreak priorities simultaneously.
