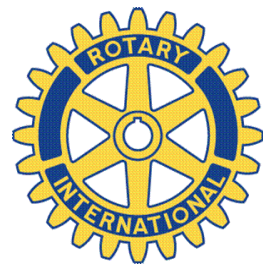




TRUMANSBURG ROTARY MEETING MINUTES FOR 10/25/12

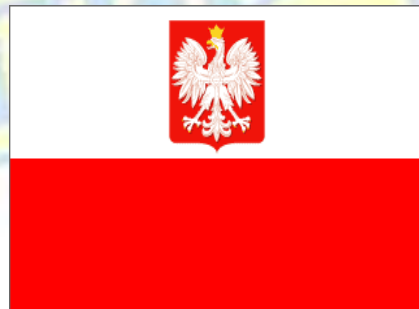
