Cindy announced that the Shelter Box organization has invited us to donate again. It was agreed to pass on this for the time being, and to support them when there is a disaster, which will give us an opportunity to engage the community and encourage their participation.

The Wheelchair Foundation requested a donation of two wheelchairs (\$300), and it was decided to wait on that until we're flush again. Peggy will ask Monty May about sending wheelchairs overseas from his wheelchair repair organization.



Ben Curtis announced that he has nine paid team registrations for the golf tournament on July 11, and is expecting, in addition, two teams from Ehrhart's, two or three from Rogan's, and two or three from Mike and Char McGuire. It looks as if we'll have the full complement of teams, and perhaps a few more. Several holes have been sponsored, including one each by Ehrhart, CFCU, and Chemung Canal. We can use some more hole sponsorships as well as more player gifts.

Ben Curtis also announced that we once again have 100% participation in the Rotary Foundation. The club matches member contributions with an additional 50% over member contributions. This year the club contribution amounts to \$3700. He requested additional support from the club of \$500 towards the Nepal Project, and has requested supplementary funds for that project from the Ithaca noon and Dryden clubs. Ben Guthrie moved and Bill Overbaugh seconded adding the \$500 to our initial stake in the Nepal Project, and the membership approved the expenditure.

Ben Guthrie noted that our funds are low, but that there are three chicken barbecues scheduled for the summer, which will help to replenish them, as will the golf tournament. The next barbecue is scheduled for June 28; details will be discussed at next week's meeting.

Dinner, a picnic-style display created by Char McGuire, was a big success. The meeting closed quietly (the bell was unavailable) with the recitation of the Four-Way Test at 8:15.
