Mark opened the meeting at 6:30 and introduced the Prisloe family. Will is interested in being an exchange student, so the family came to learn about the process. They had lots of input from the Overbaugh's (Tom, Kathleen and Bill), Frank, Shelly and Zoren.

We were sorry to hear that Cindy could not be with us because she was taken ill and went to the hospital. She called Frank before the meeting ended with good news that she's OK and is on her way home.

Kathleen reported on the Robotics grant – The grant from District Funds is \$2000, with a pledge from Trumansburg Rotary club for \$500 more. The \$2000 has been distributed to the High School team; after their spending plan has been met, they will send in all receipts, so we can forward to the grants committee for reimbursement.

Kathleen mentioned that, since the high school team already had the funds they need, she would like to offer to the junior team that they can the \$500 that they need now. Ben Curtis made a motion to give Kathleen authorization to distribute the funds as she sees fit. Seconded, and approved with no further discussion.

Mark announced that our chicken bbq has been cancelled for this weekend, because we were unable to secure a spot. We discussed options and decided our next bbq will be the Run for Life in September.

Ben Curtis brought us up to date on the Nepal project. Groton joined the effort with a pledge of \$500. Other clubs pledging \$500 are: Dryden, Endicott, Nimmonsburg and Cooperstown. Ithaca Noon has pledged \$3000 and Cortland \$2000 through the fund set up to carry on the work of Bill Cadwallader. Including Trumansburg, eight clubs in 7170 are supporting the project.

We are currently waiting for District 3292 in Nepal to sign off. There, the Jawalakhel Club has pledged \$500 and their District \$1250. In addition to matching funds from District 7170, The Rotary Foundation will be providing \$15000. Total cost is \$35000.

The project involves constructing 400 solid permanent latrines as part of a multifaceted program to provide a school and educational resources for children in desperately poor rural villages. The program also empowers women through training and micro-finance to sustain the effort after Educate the Children, the cooperating not-for-profit agency, has completed their work and moved on to other villages.

Ben Curtis also mentioned that he received a letter from District 7170, asking him if he would consider having his name in nomination for District Governor 2017-18. He asked for support from the club and we all agreed. A motion was made to endorse Ben as a nominee for District Governor and unanimously approved by the club. Nominations will be reviewed, interviews scheduled, and a selection will be made by mid-December.

Darlynne announced that Lennart, from Germany, will be arriving tomorrow, and has asked for people to pitch in and help out during times that Darlynne and Bill are committed to business projects and can't be home with him. Happy Dollars – Kim added \$5 happy dollars to the pot – because she was back after missing several meetings and was happy that her son was at home.
