- Peony. The tree peony is distinguished most noticeably from a herbaceous peony by the fact that it retains a viable above-ground woody stem that remains after the flowers and branches have shriveled and dropped off the plant in preparation for winter: it is actually a medium-sized shrub. This woody stem should not be cut back in fall and should be pruned only if its shape is to be modified. The flower buds are much larger and flatter than those on the herbaceous peony, and are the same color as the leaves. They do not secrete honey on the bud tip. They bloom in late spring and early summer and make an excellent cutflower.
